A collection of materials (artifacts) that document teaching performance.

- ~Seldin et. al. (2010)
- Represent your teaching and students' learning
- Document your approach to teaching
- Highlight & provide evidence

Importance of Teaching Portfolio

- As a 'product' of decision (evaluative, summative)
 - To communicate your teaching
- As a 'process' for development (formative, reflective)
 - Record teaching experience, reflection & feedback, assess teaching strength, improvement, generate ideas etc..


What goes into a teaching portfolio?
